THE ORGANIZATION

- The parents and the students are required to go through the Prospectus carefully before signing the Admission Form. Once the form is signed, the total responsibility of having read the rules and regulations shall lie upon the parents and the students and they shall be bound by the same.
- Attendance in the HOUSE TESTS conducted by the college is compulsory. The college will take strict disciplinary action against a student, who is found absent in the House Tests. However, the Principal may suspend or take punitive action in extraordinary circumstances.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Students are to submit themselves to the rules and regulations in force made by G.N.D.U. and the college. To help disciplinary norms, normally students are not permitted to leave the college during free period. If they have some urgent work they should get their application signed by the parents/guardians before getting it sanctioned from the tutor. In the library, corridors and campus disturbance to others is not allowed. Students are to dress up properly. On **Monday and Tuesday** students are required to come to the college in college uniform. It is also essential on special functions which shall be notified.

Students may wear only decent dresses during the rest of the week. Suits or trousers with decent

long tops are allowed. Half pants, Skirts, Sleeveless and short tops are not allowed. Use of MOBILE PHONES is not allowed in the college. Strict action would be taken against a student found guilty of using mobile in the campus.

PAY ATTENTION TO

- Students are to be punctual for classes and also deadline for various office and academic procedures has to be adhered to.
- Library and office Hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.
- Visitors may see the Principal from 1.00 to 2.00 p.m.
- Students may see the Principal from 12.00 to 1.00 p.m.

All notices require signature and necessary prior approval of the Principal.

- The college will observe the holidays mentioned by the university.
The college has its own "Diary" which is given to each student shortly after the commencement of the session. It serves as Identity Card.

The Physical Education Programme of the college helps the young players to improve their performance as the college has large spacious grounds and many games to play. Students who win Distinction in University are given college colours.

Students who take N.C.C. or N.S.S. are given many incentives and concessions in the academic field.

In order to assess the progress of the student, one terminal examination will be organised in each semester. The date-sheet will be notified to the students well in time. **In case of illness the student must inform the Controller of the examinations and submit her medical certificate. Medical Certificate of only qualified M.B.B.S. doctor will be accepted.**

IMPORTANT GUIDLINES

- The students are required to fulfil the following eligibility conditions for appearing in the final examinations of GNDU.
 - Get 25% marks in aggregate of all the subjects or 35% marks in each subject in the House Test and 30% in the special test to be conducted at the discretion of the Principal.
 - Attend 75% of the total lectures delivered in each subject taken by them including theory and practicals.
 - Clear all the dues of the college.

In case they fail to fulfil any of these conditions, they shall be detained from appearing in the final examinations of GNDU. It is the responsibility of the students to apprise their parents of all the rules and regulations.

- CONDONATION OF SHORTAGE OF LECTURES UP TO 15% IS AT PRINCIPAL'S DISCRETION AND NOT A STUDENT'S RIGHT.
- Any student found guilty of misbehaviour / disobedience shall be rusticated from the college.

NO RAGGING

UGC HAS RECOMMENDED A SYSTEM OF PROHIBITION, PREVENTION AND PUNISHMENT, TO PUT AN END TO THE MENACE OF RAGGING. STUDENTS MUST NOTE THAT RAGGING IS PUNISHABLE BY LAW.

- As per the directions of the High Court, students are not to travel in any unsafe vehicle like truck/tractor in their own interest. They are further advised to strictly observe traffic rules and wear helmets.
- Bus facility is available in the college. The information regarding route would be put up on Notice Board during admission days.

DISCIPLINE:

ACADEMIC:

Attendance of students and lectures will be watched very strictly. According to the rules prescribed by the G.N.D. University, the minimum attendance, required to be kept by the student is 75% of the total number of "Working days" means the days on which lectures are held. If a student remains absent from the college rolls for 15 days, she may get re-admitted on payment of re-admission fee along with fine for all those days of absence.

COLLEGE LEAVE RULES

- The students should apply for leave when it is absolutely necessary.
- Leave should be applied on the prescribed form available with the college office.
- Student on medical leave should submit her medical certificate along with the leave on the day she reports for classes.
- Only ten casual leaves will be allowed to each student during the whole session.
- Only ten medical leaves will be allowed to each student and that too on the production of medical certificate (Medical Certificate from qualified doctor only will be accepted, that too within a week)

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The parents are required to read the Prospectus before signing the form. Once the form is signed the total responsibility of having read the rules and regulations shall lie upon them. The student should

- purchase the Prospectus and read it carefully.
- fill the form neatly and completely
- get it signed from the parents / guardian.
- get it checked from the Incharge of Admission Committee and get it signed by the Principal.
- Students will be given admission on FIRST COME FIRST SERVE CUM MERIT basis and as per availability of seats.

LIMITED NUMBER OF SEATS IN HISTORY, HINDI, POL. SCIENCE, SOCIOLOGY, ECONOMICS, MATHS, COMPUTER SCIENCE & COMPUTER APPLICATION.

- Admitted student will pay the fee at the fee counter on the same day and deposit the form at the same counter.
- In case of delay in the payment of fees, the form will need re-validation by incharge of Admission Board.



- **The students are to get their fee receipt from the counter and check it properly before leaving the fee counter.**
- Subjects taken may be changed within the next fifteen days of admission, provided the seats are available.
- THE STUDENTS ARE ADVISED TO OPT FOR AT LEAST ONE PRACTICAL SUBJECT
- Physical Education will be given to players only.

NOTE

After every University Semester examinations the students must take admission immediately without waiting for their results.

The following certificates should be produced at the time of interview/admission.

- Attested Photostat Copy/Original Certificates and Marks Sheet of the lower examination.
- Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended (for new students only).
- Schedule Caste/Schedule/Tribe/Backward Class/outstanding players/speakers/singers/dancers/artists and best-in-acting, require supporting certificates.
- Original Migration Certificate & Eligibility Certificate issued by Boards other than Punjab Board.
- Provisional admission without submission of required certificates may be given at the risk of the students, in rare circumstances.
- 5 photographs are to be attached with the form.
- 1 copy of the Aadhar Card in case on New students.

The college offers hostel accommodation with all the modern amenities having peaceful atmosphere conducive for studies. The number of seats are limited, so candidates desirous of residing in the hostel must get their seats reserved immediately at the time of admission to the college. A separate form for admission to the hostel is provided with the prospectus that is to be filled in by the boarders. No admission in hostel without parents personal appearance in the principal's office is allowed.

- **Hostel fees Rs. 36000 per annum to be deposited in three instalments.**
- **Single room can be taken (if available) at Rs. 40000 per annum**
- **Cooler facility can be availed at charge of Rs. 1000/- per annum**
- **Switch charges (in the room) Rs. 250/- per month will be charged if the above facility is availed.**

Notice For Boarders

No student is permitted to leave the hostel during the session as per college rules. If any student has to leave the hostel, she will have to pay the fee for the full session.

Rules for Boarders

- The boarders are not allowed to take their guests to their rooms.
- Day Scholars are not allowed to visit the hostel.
- Boarders are not permitted to wear gold jewellery.
- Use of electrical appliances such as room heater, iron etc is not allowed. Students found using electrical appliances without permission will be charged heavy fine.
- Light and fan must be switched off when not in use.
- Boarders are not allowed to go to the warden's or teacher's room under any circumstances.
- Boarders are not allowed to take food to their rooms.
- Boarders are not allowed to keep more than Rs. 500/-
- Boarders should study in their own rooms.
- Hostel room and lobby must be kept clean.

Note: Boarders are responsible for the safe-keeping of their money, belongings, clothes etc. Defaulters will be punished strictly. On personal request from the parents of wards, boarders can go home on special occasions.

RULE FOR THE VISITORS

- Visitors are allowed to visit their wards during specified days and hours only.
- Visitors may visit boarders on Sundays 9.00am to 5.00pm in Summer, 10.00am to 6.00pm in winter.
- Any exception to visiting time or person must be approved by the warden.
- No guest will be allowed to stay in the hostel for the night, not even female guests.
- The visitors must sign the Visitors' Register at the gate before entering.
- Visitors will be allowed to see a boarder only upon presentation of the visitor's identification card issued by the college and signed by the parents.

- Parking is prohibited outside the hostel area.

Note: Parents must co-operate with the college authorities in maintaining discipline in the college and the Hostel. and signed by the parents.

RULES FOR BOARDERS TO VISIT HOME

- Boarders will be allowed to visit their home twice a month i.e. 1st weekend, 3rd weekend and if a student is detained at home under unforeseen circumstances, hostel warden should be informed telegraphically or telephonically. Otherwise the boarder will be considered absent at her own risk.
- No leave on unscheduled days will be sanctioned unless there is an emergency. In such situation, a letter from the parents may be considered for grant of leave.
- Boarders will go home at their own responsibility.
- For sports boarders, leave shall be granted only if it is endorsed by the teacher in-charge of games.
- When a boarder reports back, she must show her identity card duly signed by her parents to the warden.
- A boarder must sign the Student's Leave Register before leaving the hostel and on reporting back.

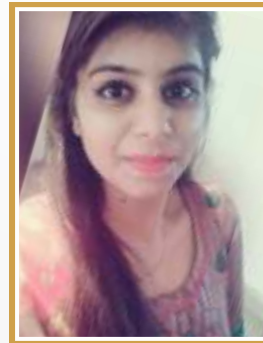

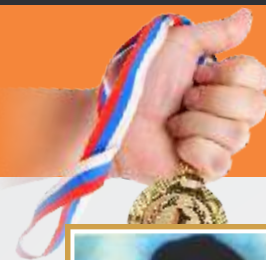
