Infrastructure

The college has splendid and aesthetically designed building in an area of 1, 50,000 Sq.yds. There is separate Science, Commerce, Arts, IT, Bio-Technology block, Edifice of 30 labs including Multimedia Labs with latest gadgets, Hi-tech Seminar Hall, A.C. Auditorium, Indoor Stadium, Gymnasium Hall, Smart Class Rooms, Language Lab, Conference Hall, Heritage Room, College Boutique, Art & Craft Bazaar, well-furnished Cafeteria, Tuck Shop, Yoga Room, Medical Room, Common Room, Kitchen Garden and Herbal Garden. There is special facility of ramps and chairs for Divyangjan. A computerized Library with 28,000 volumes for UG and PG students, Research Centre, Sports Complex, Computer Centre, PG Block, Administrative Block, Shardananad Hall, Open Air Sitting Facility, Multi-Purpose Hall and Triple storey women hostel built in green clean and serene environment providing TV Room, Library-cum-Study Room, Computer Lab with Wi-Fi facility, Dining Hall, Modernized Washrooms, Sanitary Pad Vending Machine are the facilities available for students along with fleet of buses for students' convenience who hail from far off villages. The campus has 24 hours power supply. It also has internet facility with Wi-Fi in the campus, public address system, sound system, solar heating and light system. Water coolers with purifiers are installed in all blocks. Whole campus is under the surveillance of CCTV cameras. Digital boards and Lease line are the facilities given to all considering these as the dire needs.

Criteria I: Curricular Aspects

The institution is affiliated with Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and it strictly adheres to its norms and guidelines.

- The college offers 15 UGs, 9 PGs, 2 PG Diplomas, 4 UG Diplomas and 2 Skill Hub courses.
- The college follows the curriculum designed by affiliating Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar which provides guidelines for admission. At the beginning of the session, IQAC prepares an academic calendar to ensure the efficient implementation of the curriculum given by the University. Our teachers are members of board of studies and of Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences. They substantially have contributed to the curriculum development. Time table committee with the help of department heads prepares time table for creating a schedule for the academic year.
- Members of the faculty are also engaged as university paper setters, paper evaluators
 to bring about academic excellence and student satisfaction and to ensure holistic and
 value-based education.
- The student assessment is based on attendance, continuous evaluation through classtests, assignments, presentations, mid-term examinations etc.
- Critical issues related to ethics, gender, and human values are an integral part of the teaching and learning process in various courses and are adhered to through various activities of clubs and societies.

Criteria II: Teaching Learning and Evaluation

The institution's teaching-learning approach is outcome-based education. The students are challenged to think critically and develop a love for learning that will serve them well in their future endeavors.

- Teachers assess the academic proficiency of students on the basis of internal exams, class tests, assignments etc. According to it, remedial classes and extra classes are arranged for both slow and advance learners respectively. Bridging the gap between slow learners and advanced learners is met through specific Counseling and extra efforts.
- Mentor-mentee system is well developed to cater the needs of the students. Teachers are always available to the students for any kind of counseling.
- Besides traditional classroom teaching methods, faculty members use IT enabled learning tools such as PPT, Video clippings, Audio system, online sources to expose the students for advanced knowledge and practical learning. Wi-Fi facility is made available to all the students.
- Facilities of DELNET, network resource center and virtual library are provided to the students to enhance their knowledge.
- Program Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) are displayed on the college
 website. The performance of students in university examination is always exceptional
 with a large number of university merit positions.
- The institution adopts transparency in evaluation methods. The Mechanism to deal with internal/external examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient.
- Internal assessment is limited in university curriculum, the other modes to assess the students are mid semester tests, projects and seminars etc. Final results are discussed in departmental meetings. Personal interactive sessions are conducted with students and parents as per requirement.
- Student centric, participatory and interactive learning Process is achieved through class participation, group discussion, presentations role plays and many more. In order to nurture the critical thinking, creativity and scientific temper among the students, the students are encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities like Quiz, Essay writing, Debate, Elocution Competitions and Exhibitions etc.

Several seminars/webinars, workshops on intellectual property rights, entrepreneurship and research methodology are organized to enhance research quality and professional ethics.
- To support the holistic development of students, several outreach programs are conducted by NCC, NSS, Red Ribbon Club and Red Cross Unit.

• Awareness drives regarding environmental sustainability and gender inequalities are organized to imbibe the moral and social responsibilities among students. The institution has been recognized at various fronts for its extension activities.

Criteria IV: Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The college has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. The infrastructure set up of the entire campus aids teachers and students towards achieving academic excellence.

- The lush green campus of our college is spread over 8 acres of land interspersed
 with multi-building structure. The college building has four blocks; Arts Block,
 Science Block, Commerce Block and PG Block.
- The college has 43 spacious, well-ventilated and well-lighted classrooms. Seven rooms are smart classrooms with ICT facilities. All laboratories have adequate and well-maintained equipment to conduct experiments. Availability of Language lab allows students to practice the language with wide variety of exercises and activities on computer.
- The college provides round a clock Wi-Fi facility in the whole college campus. Campus Area is kept under 24/7 surveillance with CCTV Cameras for facilitating a secure environment for all the students.
- The college libraries are fully automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) and comprise of rich collection of carefully selected 28,000 books, journals, magazines etc. The library is connected to e-resources through DELNET for resource sharing.
- E-resource Centre has been established in the Library which enables students and teachers to access information for their academic pursuits through internet and e-resources.
- Book Bank facility is given to meritorious and economically backward students.
- The Institution has a spacious sports ground with 400 meters running track near
 Mugrala (outside college campus) to hold regular sports activities.
- Gymnasium Hall is well-equipped with modern equipment. An Indoor Stadium provides a covered space for various indoor sports and recreational activities.

- The college has a Heritage Centre based on Punjabi culture.
- The college provides facility of cafeteria, tuck shop and a photocopy unit which serve students at genuine prices. Adequate parking area is available to facilitate students.
- A well-maintained hostel with a capacity to accommodate 200 students is inside the campus. Common room is provided to the students for sitting in their free periods.
- Medical room is provided to help the students in case of any emergency. The college provides all kinds of first aid, medicines and other minor medical services as per the emergency needs. We make sure that First Aid Kit is always available.
- Optimal utilization of the infrastructure is ensured and the college fulfills the social
 responsibility by sharing the infrastructure with other institutions, district administration,
 and NGOs.

Criterion V: Student Support and Progression

The college has the mission of providing value-based quality education to its students.

- The institution creates awareness and provides support to eligible students for applying and availing various scholarships. Fifty percent fee concession is given to fatherless students. - Vermi compositing is also done in the campus and compost made by worms is sold to staff and also used in college lawns. Waste chemicals in the laboratories are properly disposed.
- The parts of old computers and electronic items are used for repairing and replacement of PCs. Some e-waste is sold to vendors for recycling.
- The college utilizes solar energy and LED lamps to reduce energy consumption.
- Botanical garden with medicinal and ornamental plants is one of the specialties. The
 college has organized a number of green activities outside the college campus.
- The institution maintains the quality of the green initiatives by undertaking green audit, energy audit, and environment audit.

Student Support Services

NCC: The college is running company of 160 cadets for the development of the student community. NCC is doing a commendable service in the College. There are numerous activities organized by this unit during the assessment period. The college organises various programs, like camps, series of special lectures on different occasions and ensure participation in well-defined movements like Swatch Bharat Abhiyaan, Blood Donation Camp, AIDS Awareness Rally, Disaster Management etc.

National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit: The college is successfully running five units of NSS. These units are rendering service to society. NSS units organizes 10 days NSS special Camp each year. Important days, like National Youth Day, Republic Day, International Women Day, World Health Day, World Environment Day, World No Tobacco Day, World Population Day, Sadhbhawna Divas and NSS Day are also celebrated by these units.

Youth Red Cross Unit: It is observed that the college is highly respected by the society for producing the students with human values. The unit has a considerable volunteer strength. Volunteers participated in state level camps organized by National Red Cross, Chandigarh. Red Cross volunteers participate in community service programs, blood donation camps, road safety programs.

Red Ribbon Club is performing various community welfare services. It has organized various awareness campaigns.

Youth Welfare Department: The students under the guidance of this department participated in university and inter-college youth festivals and had won several champion trophies. The department also organized several cultural Workshops and inter-state cultural programs.

"Enlightened Minds" Psychology Club organized sessions for the mental health of students.

The club extends psychological counselling to the students as well as the college employes.

Alumni Association: The college has a registered Alumni Association under the Societies Registration Act. Observations and Suggestions given by Audit Committee

Criterion I - Curricular Aspects

- 1) The Departmental Activity Planner needs to be implemented properly.
- 2) The students should be encouraged to join career oriented short-term online courses.
- 3) The students' feedback system could be further strengthened with online feedback, its evaluation and remediation accordingly.

Criterion II - Teaching Learning and Evaluation

- 1) Regional diversity of students and faculty can be strengthened.
- 2) Attainment of POs and Cos should be properly evaluated.
- 3) There is a lot of scope of further innovating in teaching and learning process. The faculty members should be encouraged to try out new teaching technologies and evaluate its' impact.

Criterion III - Research, Innovations and Extension

- 1) Teaching faculty should be encouraged for more research activities.
- 2) More efforts should be done on IPR and entrepreneurship.
- 3) Faculty should be encouraged to enhance their skills by attending FDPs/FTPs and career advancement programs.
- 4) Teaching faculty should be encouraged to apply for seminars, conferences, workshops and research projects to receive grants from UGC, ICSSR, DST and non-government bodies etc.

Criterion IV - Infrastructure and Learning Resources

- 1) To provide physical facilities as per the needs of students.
- 2) The library services could be optimally utilized. The students and the faculty may be encouraged to use the various facilities available in the library. This will also boost in generating new ideas for research.
- 3) Certain infrastructural areas of the college need little bit of up-gradation and maintenance. The same should be done on a regular basis.
- 4) The departments which are doing well should be further supported with space, manpower and financial incentives so that they could become center of excellence.

Criterion V - Student Support and Progression

- 1) Skill based programs should be organized to cater the needs of the students.
- 2) Increase the participation of college alumni in the development of the college.
- The students should be encouraged to apply for scholarships on National scholarship portal.

Criterion VI - Governance, Leadership and Management

- 1) It is recommended to take more quality assurance initiatives.
- 2) A Student Welfare Committee should be formed and the welfare fund be utilized for the same purpose.
- ICT enabled equipment could be used to provide additional computers and resources to the departments.

Criterion VII - Institutional Values and Best Practices

1) Involvement of social programs should be increased
